## SPORTS PREMIUM REPORTING – ACADEMIC YEAR 2015 – 2016

Primary Schools receive PE and Sport Premium Funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil. St. Mary's School Funding for 2015-2016 was £9035 and was spent as detailed in the table below:

With support from HSSP we achieved our first Gold School Games Mark recognising our achievements in PE and School Sport through the year. To provide equipment for Extra-Curricular activities, this will allow more clubs to run and more children able to take part.	£700	New equipment has been utilised across all classes for Curriculum P.E. providing more opportunity to learn different skills and provide differentiated activities within the sessions. Equipment bought for extra-curricular activities (Cheerleading equipment, Tennis Equipment and Cricket equipment) allowed for a wider range of activities to take place providing opportunities for different year groups to participate.
To purchase transport for whole class competitions at St. John Fisher High School	To provide transport at no cost to parents to allow all children to compete in competitions against and with other schools.	£800	Children in all year groups were able to participate in Inter and Intra School competitions at their local High School. This provided excellent sporting opportunities for all children as well as continuing to build on relationships with the partner High School
To purchase awards for Sports Awards Evening and resources for Intra-School Competitions	To host an end of year celebration of achievements in Curriculum P.E. and HSSP competitions.	£600	90 children from Key Stage 2 attended the evening to receive medals and certificates for being part of a school team that competed at a Level 2 School Games competition. Awards were also presented to
